

The Program for All-inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE) is a fully integrated, community-based care program for adults 55 and older living with chronic illnesses and disabilities with services administered by an interdisciplinary care team. PACE provides individualized care to over 12,000 frail seniors in California.

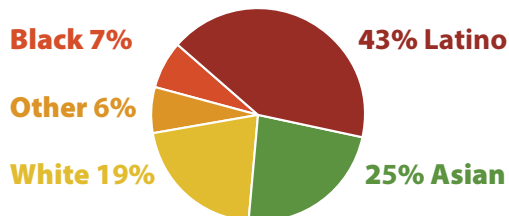
